THOUGHTS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

All of us at Sharing Meadows lost a cherished friend and supporter when Chris Choncoff died on December 11. He served on our Board of Directors since 1996; however his commitment to Share Foundation began earlier.

I first met Chris in 1993 when he contacted me to inquire about residency at Sharing Meadows for his daughter, Tina. Our community was just beginning at that point, with only the Elias Building in place and the main entrance road under construction. I showed Chris and his wife around the grounds, especially where the homes would be built and explained our plans for a community. Chris was caught up in the excitement and immediately offered to help in any way he could. He told me that he wanted to be part of Sharing Meadows even if his daughter didn't end up living there because he firmly believed in our mission. Help he did; coming from Hobart to Sharing Meadows on a regular basis to cut grass, clear brush and complete any tasks that needed to be done.

He was delighted when his daughter was accepted to be one of the first Villagers at Sharing Meadows, eagerly anticipating the completion of the village and reminding me again that he was available to help. Once the houses were delivered and the hookups were complete, there was still so much to be done to prepare for the Villager's arrival and turn the houses into homes. I remember one day when I was at Sharing Meadows awaiting the arrival of the bedroom furniture we'd ordered for the three homes. After arguing unsuccessfully with the deliverymen that they should assemble the beds, I found myself a do-it-yourselfer by default and resigned myself to staying until the job was completed. A few minutes later the door opened and in walked Chris, telling me he had come to cut grass but decided to stop in to say hello when he saw my car. When I told him what I was doing, he got to work immediately and we worked side by side for the rest of the morning, assembling the beds, putting the box springs and mattresses in place and arranging the furniture in each of the bedrooms. Chris's presence made a tedious job enjoyable and we certainly finished it quicker than I could have done alone.

Chris was first and foremost, a family man who was deeply devoted to his wife, Joyce, two sons, one daughter and two grandchildren. He was a teacher and his quiet, gentle nature coupled with his keen desire to serve others, made him a great one along with being a role model his students could emulate. He truly cared about others and his dedication to Share Foundation's mission made him an asset to his service on our Board of Directors. He enthusiastically gave a helping hand where it was needed; serving on committees, faithfully maintaining the grounds, cooking at camp, and working at the Leprechaun Hunt© each year. He felt a great deal of peace knowing that his daughter was happy in her home at Sharing Meadows and he often stated that he wished other parents could experience the same sense of peace that he did.

Rest in peace, dear Chris. We will miss you at Sharing Meadows but we realize that your goodness will live on as we continue to fulfill the vision you believed in so sincerely of providing fullness of life for other abled people.

PLANNED GIVING CENTER

Wills 101: The Cornerstone of Estate Planning

Over the past 13 years, Sharing Meadows has experienced tremendous growth. Beginning with our initial 185-acre land purchase, the property now includes our St. Timothy Camp building, a swimming pool, two utility buildings, a lake and activities area, beautiful groves and orchards, the Village of St. John, the Village of St. Vincent, heavy equipment to maintain the grounds and residences, and much, much more! All of these blessings have been made possible through the continuous support of our loyal friends—donors who support us annually; friends who request memorials for their loved ones; families who send their other-abled loved ones to camp; board members; community partners; local businesses, and so on. It's no secret that our supporters feel protective of the safe and nurturing community that we provide for the Villagers—their contributions tell us so. For many who have retired from their jobs or sold their businesses and raised their families, the question becomes this: ***what happens to the dream of Sharing Meadows when they pass on?***

We have spent many months in this column describing different options for making planned gifts. In this issue, we thought we'd get back to basics and answer some of the questions we are often asked about how you might continue the legacy of giving—the legacy of love that has built a community we can all participate in and be proud of—for eternity.

Here are some frequently asked questions pertaining to the basics of drafting a will. As with every decision you make that involves your finances, we strongly urge you to consult your legal adviser or financial planner before making any changes that will affect your personal circumstances.

Who should make a will?

Everyone should consider making a will and realize that the need grows as your assets and dependents increase. For instance, wills become particularly crucial for parents with children who are minors or others you would have to consider making arrangements for financial support in the event of your death. Married couples should also seriously consider making a will in the event of the death of a spouse.

What is the process if there is no will?

If you die without a will, generally speaking, the surviving spouse is entitled to half of the estate and any children divide the other half. If a person dies without a will and without any traceable heirs, all property goes to the state. Many of our faithful donors have raised children who are successful in their own right, and have less of a need to inherit their parent's entire estate. If that is your situation, why not consider making a bequest to Share Foundation in your will? By naming Share Foundation, you can give a gift of cash, stock, or real estate that will benefit Sharing Meadows in perpetuity. Many donors and families feel that leaving a bequest to a charitable organization they have supported throughout their lifetime is a meaningful way to leave a legacy and ensure that their lifelong values are preserved even after death.

Can someone who is senile or incapacitated write a will?

As a general rule, no. A valid will can only be made by a person of sound mind who is able to recognize his or her family, and able to recall what property he or she owns. A person must also be capable of communicating in order to write a will. That is why it is best to get one's affairs in order early so that you can be sure that your wishes are expressed and carried out.

Do wills have to be notarized?

Generally, wills do not have to be notarized; however, proper witnessing is the important thing. Nearly all states require that there be at least 2 witnesses, but many states require 3 or more. Witnesses must be adults, and it is best to choose witnesses who are young enough that they are likely to be alive when the will goes through probate. Also, it is best to choose disinterested witnesses or those who are not named in the will. Some states allow self-proving wills or wills accompanied by a sworn statement from witnesses signed before a notary public. Acceptance of these sworn statements is not automatic, however, and the probate court is more likely to honor them if the will was executed and supervised by an attorney.

How do I make a bequest to Share Foundation?

When making changes to your will, it is advisable that you have a lawyer make the change by adding a codicil. Also, you might want advice about whether an entirely new will is needed. By adding a codicil to your will that names Share Foundation as the recipient of a specific bequest and describes the nature of your gift, you are continuing the community of Sharing Meadows for other-abled individuals for generations and generations. Here is some suggested language for a bequest: "I give ___% of my estate to Share Foundation with the Handicapped, Inc., P.O. Box 400, Rolling Prairie, IN 46371-0400, for the uses and purposes of said organization."


